A Time to Celebrate...?

As I write this, we're just coming to the end of the period of 50 days celebration of Easter, and I'm turning my mind to the next few Sundays where we celebrate Pentecost and Trinity Sunday before moving soon into the long period of 'ordinary time' within the church year.

I love that we have such a long time of celebration for Easter, though I'm not sure we really do it justice sometimes! So I've been looking forward to the afternoon of Pentecost Sunday (which will have passed by the time you read this) and the opportunity to be in one of the pubs in Garforth singing some 'Assembly Bangers': those songs we used to sing at Sunday School or in School Assembly that bring a little nostalgia, but also a great sense of celebration.

Walking into the pub to ask if we could be there on that occasion to sing these songs, I suddenly felt a little self-conscious -not a usual feeling for me! The reason is that, while of course I knew the staff would probably recognise our major times of celebration as Christians (we played music there at Christmas-time, and I was sure that Easter hadn't escaped their notice!) I wondered how I could explain that Pentecost is a time of great celebration for us too, remembering when the Spirit came upon the Apostles and the church was born!

Fortunately, it was no trouble to explain it at all, the staff were very excited about it, and I walked away happy with the plan.

But it made me think – are we known for being a people who celebrate?

I would like us to be!

I wonder if we're known much more for what people perceive as the grumpy side of faith, believing us to be a bunch of people that are boring, strict, intolerant, unwelcoming, often divided.

Throughout the New Testament, we're reminded that we are called to be a people of joy, welcome, celebration! Jesus' first miracle is turning water into wine so that a wedding celebration can continue in full swing! Perhaps there are too many ways over the centuries and in different places that we've been focussed on the nitty gritty, mundane bits of keeping a church going that we've forgotten to first be a people that celebrate life and God's love for each of us.

So, a challenge for us all.

What is there to celebrate?

How can we do it?

How might we share that celebration with our communities and beyond?

<u>Leeds South and East Foodbank (Trussell Trust)</u> <u>Helping local people in crisis</u>

In April your Church delivered 10 baskets of food weighing 144Kg to the Leeds South and East Trussell Trust distribution centre. In the last 2 years this centre has seen an increase of 54% of people relying on them for food. 16,937 local people were supplied with emergency food in 2023 - 2024 and the number still grows.

Crafting a Fairer Future

You may have noticed that large numbers of wildflowers are sprouting in Leeds city centre. They are bringing joy and a sense of natural regeneration.

Anna Bland is passionate about social and environmental justice. She has set up a craftivism group here in Leeds. Craftivism is activism through craft. The Leeds Craftivists group is part of Leeds Sanctuary (formerly Leeds Methodist Mission). They meet monthly to hear talks from experts, chat about issues that concern them and, after a short meditation, make pieces of art by crocheting, knitting, drawing and painting.

The beautiful items they produce are sent, with letters explaining the group's views on a particular issue, to local council members to call on them to vote for change. One of the group's principles is that as they hope to build a kinder, gentler world, then their actions must be kind and gentle too.

A key focus of the craftivists over the past year has been biodiversity. Members noticed that while parts of Leeds, with their new developments and emphasis on green spaces were good places for wildlife, some of the longer established areas of the city seemed to have been forgotten. So the group launched a campaign to raise awareness of the importance of providing habitats for wildlife and calling on the city council to plant wildflowers to support insects and birds.

Linking to the RSPB's Attack on Nature campaign, calling on national Government to protect biodiversity, the craftivists invited local people to craft two bees – one to send to their local MP, and the second to contribute to the craftivists' local campaign to create a pollinator corridor in Leeds city centre.

The group found that Leeds City Council were receptive to the campaign, and they started planting wildflower seeds across the city. Community members were also encouraged to plant seeds, which they could obtain from the group. A real success story for the Leeds Craftivists! Their latest campaign focusses on our 'rubbish'. They want to see a food waste collection offered to everyone in Leeds. This would help every household do their bit to reduce emissions and create a more sustainable food system. They are working with two groups; 'Compost-it' and 'Incredible Edible' to stop food waste going to landfill in Leeds. They are aiming to craft enough small pieces of food out of yarn, felt or paper to send one to every councillor in Leeds, with a postcard about the benefits of composting.

The History of Cross Gates Libraries - Part Three By East Leeds History & Archaeology Society

The Archive Ambassador Project of 2005 was a brilliant initiative where the West Yorkshire Archive Service, Leeds Library Services and our Society, worked together to create an easier and better way for the local community to access archives and information. This became very popular for those seeking information about their Family History, and was well used not only by the local community but, through the internet, for people throughout the UK, and even from overseas.

The library has been a valuable asset to the local community, and we were delighted to wish it 'Happy Birthday' in 2009 when in December the Library joined forces with us to celebrate its 70th anniversary. This featured a week long series of events. It started with an Open Day on Saturday 12th December where ELHAS arranged for an outside caterer to create a lovely spread of 'finger food' for visitors, and library staff kept tea and coffee flowing. Our archives were opened up for people to look at, many local OS maps proved popular, and colouring and local history quiz's with answers within the Heritage Room were available for children to take part in. Various other activities such as 'Meet the Author' sessions, a family history workshop, carol singing by a local school and an illustrated talk of 'Cross Gates Past and Present' took place later during the week.

In 2016, the 100th anniversary of the tragic accident at the No1 Shell Filling Factory at Barnbow attracted the BBC to come to the Heritage Room in the library. They wanted to film the story of Barnbow and what happened there in December 1916. We then took the film crew to the site of the explosion, and this was later shown on the BBC 'Inside Out' programme. Part of it was also featured on Look North.

Unfortunately, we could not organise anything for the library's 80th anniversary in 2019 due to covid. Early in 2020, we were informed in a meeting with library management, that the library was closing for refurbishment and all our displays had to be dismantled. Some were returned to their owners, and our archive was removed and put into storage. In the few years since then we have had little communication with the library and only found out about its forthcoming sale at the same time as everybody else.

On reflection however, when we look back over the past 25 years or so, we can personally say that being part of ELHAS, and being part of a successful partnership with Leeds Library Services, Leeds Museums and Galleries, and on occasion the West Yorkshire Archive Service, it has been a wonderful creative experience. The librarians and curators we have met have all been friendly, helpful and enthusiastic, and it is always a pleasure to see them. We have met many members of the public who have likewise been warm and friendly towards us. We thank them all for their interest and support as without that support, none of this would ever have happened.
