

# Edward's Letter

Greetings everyone,

I trust and pray the New Year 2025 is going well so far with you and your loved ones. I'm writing this letter seven days to "Candlemas,"

traditionally the 40<sup>th</sup> day of (and conclusion of) the Christmas – Epiphany Season, celebrated every year on the 2nd of February. This year it'll receive more attention from churches as it falls on a Sunday.

In bygone centuries, Christians said their last farewells to the Christmas season on Candlemas, 2 February. This is exactly 40 days after Christmas Day itself. In the New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'Public Appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child – to 'present him to the Lord'. At the same time, she, as a new mother, was 'purified'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

So where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the 'Light of the World,' and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day. The Church also fell into the custom of blessing the year's supply of candles for the church on this day – hence the name, Candlemas.

The story of how Candlemas began can be found in Luke 2: 22-40. Simeon's great declaration of faith and recognition of who Jesus was is of course found in the Nunc Dimittis. Making candles, telling stories, having dinner by candlelight has been a simple formula for celebrating Candlemas over the years at home.

As we celebrate Candlemas, symbolizing Jesus as the "Light of the World" be reminded that we are also the light of the world, therefore, let our light so shine among fellow human beings that they may see our good works, and glorify our Father who is in heaven.

## **Try a Carbon Fast?**

Caring for creation is one of our instructions from God. As we move towards the period of Lent, many of us will be thinking about how we will be focussing more firmly on God through a fast. We often think of this period as fasting from good things to eat or drink, but how about another suggestion? How about considering a Carbon Fast to help us to live more simply and finding new ways to cut our own carbon footprint as a way of caring for God's creation?

The following are some of the sorts of things we could do:

- 1. Fast from unawareness by watching a TV programme or listening to a podcast to find out more about climate change
- 2. Fast from food waste through making a plan for our leftovers, and composting fruit and veg scraps.
- 3. Fast from excessive energy use through turning down the thermostat, walking, cycling or taking public transport more or fasting from social media use (having a games night instead?)
- 4. Fast from meat and dairy through trying to go meat free for a day or two a week. If you're already vegetarian or vegan, how about cutting down on desserts or sweets?
- 5. Fast from Silence through praying for creation and talking about the climate crisis.

## Stationing update

There's been a lot of work going on in the Circuit to prepare for Summer 2025 when 4 of the current presbyters (Revd Becki Stennett, Revd Mark Stennett, Revd Edward Sakwe and Revd George Bailey) leave the Leeds North and East Circuit. This note is to update you on what we know so far about those joining and those leaving the Circuit!

Subject to confirmation at Conference 2025:

- Revd Emily Young will be serving at Roscoe, Trinity and Chapel Allerton churches
- Revd Janet Titterton will be serving at Garforth, Scholes, Colton, Cross Gates and Christ Church Halton (joint with the URC minister Revd Dr Nicola Robinson).
- Revd Becki Stennett has been stationed to the Coventry and Nuneaton Circuit in the Birmingham District, with pastoral charge over Central Hall Coventry.
- Revd Mark Stennett has been stationed to the Lichfield and Tamworth Circuit in the Birmingham District, with pastoral charge over Lichfield Methodist Church, and the family will be based in Lichfield.
- Revd Dr George Bailey is being appointed to the role of Methodist Oversight Tutor at the Queen's Foundation in Birmingham. The stationing process is underway to seek a replacement presbyter to serve in our Circuit, with pastoral charge of Oakwood (joint with a Church of England priest), Newbourne and Barwick churches.
- Revd Tanya Short will continue in her role as Circuit Superintendent (no longer a shared appointment from September 2025) with pastoral charge of Alwoodley Park, Lidgett Park and Shadwell churches.
- Rev Edward Sakwe has been appointed to the Hinckley Circuit in Leicestershire, with pastoral oversight of three churches - Hinckley at the heart of its community accommodating uniformed organisations, charity groups and a pre-school group; Burbage, an outward and forward looking church with a new building, hosts or runs a range of weekly activities; and Sapcote, a warm welcoming church with a strong church family feel.

Please continue to pray for everyone involved in these processes and changes, and for the work of God in the circuit.


For catering purposes please can you let Helen Lappage at Christ Church or Kathryn Glasby at Colton know if you hope to attend, by the end of February if possible.

# Christ Church Halton Local Ecumenical Partnership Review

We met on Saturday afternoon, 25<sup>th</sup> January, for our review workshop. We had an excellent attendance, a lovely soup and sweet lunch and fellowship followed by a focused workshop.

Rev'd Jamie Kissack (Moderator of the United Reformed Church Yorkshire Synod) and Rev'd David Goodall (District Mission Enabler in the Yorkshire West Methodist District) directed our thoughts to our effectiveness as a worshiping community in Halton as we focused on our Mission Statement written as our denominations began to work together as a Local Ecumenical Project.

Are we a missional church? What do we do well and what might we do better? What of our future? Are we sustainable in terms of people helping to run things in five, let alone ten years and also in financial terms with annual deficits increasing?

Despite our concerns about the future, there was encouragement in the stories that were shared about things we do well and the consensus that we still have a good foundation on which to build. We look forward to receiving a report of the discussion and we will see the key ideas/themes that arise.

We express our thanks to those who planned, set up, catered and cleared away and to Jamie, David and our own ministers Nicola and Edward for their leadership and guidance.

So there is already some work to do. We will review our Misson Statement as well as continuing to review our Finances. The stewards of the five churches in our Circuit section have already started working together and will continue to build on this. We will begin discussing our priorities when the Stewards meet with Jamie and our ministers in March. We will pray that God will guide us and that our ears and eyes will be open to that guidance as we move forward together as a church.

We thought of our "voyage" on the journey of life, using it as a metaphor as to how we live our lives as Christians.


