Nicola's Letter

Dear friends,

Letter

I start with a wee admission. I'm a big fan of 'To do' lists. Especially when it is colour-coded in rainbow colours. There's something really satisfying about being able to tick off items when they are complete.

When I was training for ministry, I remember one close mentor telling/warning me that: 'in ministry, the 'to do list' never ends.' Another experienced minister, recently expressed to me: 'at the end of the week throw out your 'to do list', God doesn't mind that every task may not be finished. Then rest and make a new one.'

Turning to the Bible, Exodus 20: 8-10 which reads: "Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labour and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God."

In this context, the Israelites are encouraged to observe the SABBATH, which means work or activity and rest are recognised as part of a symbiotic relationship. The word Sabbath extends beyond rest and comes from the Hebrew 'shabbat' which means 'stop', 'cease', 'be complete'. Indeed, sabbath is not simply the absence of work or activity but incorporates an holistic way of living and recognising and experiencing the presence of God.

One of the key ways that I nourish my relationship with God as well as find rest and refreshment is walking: in the hills, in the woods or by the sea with Maisie. For me, it is in these locations where God feels so palpably close and I am intimately interconnected with all living beings. The words of Wendell Berry resonate strongly: "Sabbath observance invites us to stop. It invites us to rest. It asks us to notice that while we rest, the world continues without our help. It invites us to delight in the world's beauty and abundance."

I wonder, what ways do you stop and notice the presence of God in your life? Is it through nature? In relationships with other people? Is it in a piece of music or art? Or something completely different?

Ongoing discussions at Colton relating to ministry in the Circuit from September 2025

Many of you will be aware by now that Revd Becki will be entering the stationing process and will be moving to a new appointment in September 2025, as will Revd Mark Stennett and Revd Edward Sakwe. Stewards from the churches affected by these decisions will be involved in the stationing process and we'll update you as the work progresses.

The Circuit Meeting has previously agreed that the Circuit will seek to replace 2 of the 3 appointments, which means that we need to prepare for a reduced number of ministers within the circuit from next year. As we've previously reported, steward representatives from Scholes, Cross Gates, Garforth and Colton have started to consider new ways of worship and joint services and there are areas other than worship that we will be reviewing as a Church Council, to support the decisions made by the Circuit and to agree what action we can take as a church to manage the reduced number of ministers.

At the June Circuit Meeting decisions were made about the shape of the circuit going forward from Sept 2025. This is so that when the Circuit takes part in the stationing process, details of the churches that will come under the new appointment(s) can be outlined to any minister seeking a new appointment. As far as our church at Colton is concerned the Circuit Meeting agreed in principle to a proposal that our current section (Colton, Cross Gates, Garforth and Scholes) would continue from Sept 2025, but with the addition of Christ Church.

This may seem a large section for one minister, but with joint working already under exploration, and hopefully with the support of all the congregations, we welcome the return of Christ Church to our section and look forward to all the opportunities being part of this section brings.

Christ Church Halton LEP Ministry from September 2025

Following on from Kathryn and Elaine's article I would like to provide an update about ministry at Christ Church Halton LEP. Revd Edward will be entering the stationing process and will therefore be leaving Christ Church in the summer of 2025. Revd Nicola will be continuing as URC Minister at Christ Church, and her other Churches, as agreed by the URC Leeds Partnership team. Discussions within our Methodist Circuit and URC Synod as well as URC Partnership have begun as our joint Methodist/URC ministry is due for review. Our Church Council feel that we have benefitted from having leadership from both our denominations and that this should continue.

The proposal from the Circuit is that Christ Church will join the grouping of Colton, Cross Gates, Garforth and Scholes as it was noted that the close links particularly with Colton, have been missed. Christ Church representatives will be entering discussions with Circuit Stewards and other Stewards from our group of Churches to plan for the 2025 stationing which will include compiling a profile of our church and what ministerial gifts might assist us with our outreach and growth.

We ask for your continued prayers for all involved in the stationing process, in the discussions on ways to work together as a grouping of churches and in looking at ways to move forward as part of our Circuit and Partnership. If anyone any questions or concerns please feel free to speak to either a steward or one of our ministers.




Craft and a Chat

Summer Holiday Club

2024 is our fourth year of running termly Holiday Clubs. Around 50 children per day attend for 4 days per week over 4 weeks. Many families struggle financially in the holidays so it's a real privilege to support them. Children aged 4-11 years take part in five 30-minute activity sessions such as crafts, cooking or games. After a hot lunch, everyone comes together for party games, interactive talks and drama with a Christian theme.

75% of children are on free school meals and one third have special educational needs or disabilities.
