

# Becki's Letter

As I write this, we're just coming to the end of the period of 50 days celebration of Easter, and I'm turning my mind to celebrations of Pentecost and

Trinity Sunday before we move into the long period of 'ordinary time' within the church year. I love that we have such a long time of celebration for Easter, though I'm not sure we really do it justice sometimes! So I've been looking forward to the afternoon of Pentecost Sunday (which will have passed by the time you read this) and the opportunity to be in one of the pubs in Garforth singing some 'Assembly Bangers': those songs we used to sing at Sunday School or in School Assembly that bring a little nostalgia, but also a great sense of celebration. Walking into the pub to ask if we could be there on that occasion to sing these songs, I suddenly felt a little self-conscious -not a usual feeling for me! The reason is that, while of course I knew the staff would probably recognise our major times of celebration as Christians (we played music there at

Christmas-time, and I was sure that Easter hadn't escaped their notice!) I wondered how I could explain that Pentecost is a time of great celebration for us too, remembering when the Spirit came upon the Apostles and the church was born!



Fortunately, it was no trouble to explain it at all,

the staff were very excited about it, and I walked away happy with the plan. But it made me think – are we known for being a people who celebrate? I would like us to be! I wonder if we're known much more for what people perceive as the grumpy side of faith, believing us to be a bunch of people that are boring, strict, intolerant, unwelcoming, often divided. Throughout the New Testament, we're reminded that we are called to be a people of joy, welcome, celebration! Jesus' first miracle is turning water into wine so that a wedding celebration can continue in full swing! Perhaps there are too many ways over the centuries and in different places that we've been focussed on the nitty gritty, mundane bits of keeping a church going that we've forgotten to first be a people that celebrate life and God's love for each of us.

So, a challenge for us all. What is there to celebrate? How can we do it? How might we share that celebration with our communities and beyond? Answers on a postcard, by email, or over a coffee please!

# Arthur T. Blamires (1930 – 2024)

Arthur and Joan's youngest son, Michael, passes on his and the family's grateful thanks to all who helped on the day with his Dad's funeral and with the prior arrangements. He is pleased to be able to submit the following tribute;

"From the early 1960's Dad was a great supporter of the church at Halton Methodist Chapel and then later at Christ Church.



Mum and Dad have made so many close and enduring friendships here,

Dad was a great believer in the work of the church and endeavoured to live by Christian principles by helping others.

Dad understood that friendships were the key to a happy life and so he very much valued the social aspect of the church at Halton but also he had many friends from his career as a teacher at Temple Moor and then later after retirement as a professional artist.

Having lots of interests and being active and doing lots of things was Dad's ethos for a fulfilling life and as a teacher he was passionate about passing this outlook onto his students. Dad believed it was his duty as a teacher not only to educate to pass exams but to inspire his pupils into leading rich and fulfilling lives. His field trips to the Lake District and Scotland were inspiring, leading to students appreciating nature and the world around them and through this expanding their horizons.

Mark and I are fortunate to have had such special Dad and a loving and caring family home where Dad supported us in any way he could. He always respected our life choices and we look back on wonderful childhoods.

We will miss Dad dearly. However, the sadness will be eased for us by the bank of wonderful memories that we have and Dad will always be in our hearts." Michael. **Arthur Blamires** will be remembered by many and especially by those who treasure his wonderful paintings and prints of Lake District scenery. Here are a few other memories of Arthur from those who knew him:

Ann Waterhouse has fond memories of Arthur when he and Joan joined her and her husband Rev'd John on trips to the Holy Land. She shares a story of a very memorable occasion when Arthur and Bill, another minister friend, sang an appropriate old Sankey chorus out in the middle of the Sea of Galilee in a storm! Arthur and Joan also made visits to John when he was leading a very restricted life for the 9 years following his stroke. They managed to get John out to share meals with them which were always happy times.

**Steve Hardy** and his lifelong friends from the time, recall Arthur's energy and enthusiasm as a leader at the Methodist Youth Club in the 60s.

Foremost in **Alison Roberts'** recollection of Arthur were his informed and valued contributions at the house fellowship groups they both attended.

**Roger Guy** remembers Arthur as a very supportive and approachable teacher at Temple Moor Grammer School who 'got him through' to attaining Geography O' Level. Sue Guy recalls that Arthur raised a lot of money for the new building, through his painting demonstration events at which he auctioned that session's painting. Both Sue and Roger remember him with love as a kind, thoughtful member of our church.

**Thelma Lappage** holds dear the memories of Arthur, a fellow piano player, bringing her 'Sankey' scores to play during church offertory. She also reminds us how beautiful his garden was and how his art and love of nature reflected his faith and belief in God our creator.

**Anna Lomax** reminds us that Arthur added his artist's input as part of our 'Banner Group', helping to create, amongst others, our lovely Music and Pentecost banners.

**Virginia Atkinson** remembers Arthur as a teacher at Bingley Grammer School where she often, as a student of the local girls' school, visited to watch the boys' rugby team play with a particular eye on the team captain.

I remember his intelligent observations, his sometimes-forthright views but mostly his gentle sense of humour. **Martin Lappage.**

# **Christ Church Halton Guild**

May has seen a number of events in which the Guild has participated starting with coffee and cake on the 7th when a good number arrived to enjoy refreshments and conversation.

What has also been significant this month is the change of weather with some nice sunny days to be enjoyed in exchange for soggy wet clothes to be endured!

The weather was very significant for the Guild Spring Plant Sale when forecasters were reporting heavy rain for much of the period right up to the day before the sale started. While we had one or two cold mornings there was no rain at all. Prayers were answered indeed, making a big difference to the final result.

Sales were very brisk with several people spending over £100.00 on hanging baskets alone. Plants, which we bought from our supplier, Trevor, who has a small garden centre near Selby, we're, as always very popular, but a large difference on previous years was the number of plants people had grown from their own stock by cuttings or division, which were sold by us without any cost. We also sold other items, such as gardening gloves, books, refreshments, etc, bringing the final result on a turnover of £5187.24 to £2781.24. This is the highest amount ever raised from the sale, and the money has gone into Church funds.

So a big thank you to all who all who participated in any way.

I suspect too often the ache to 'have" is stronger by far than the pleasure of "having". It may well be that desire, while always pointing to the fulfilment of its own yearning, produces its own kind of distinctive, irresistible pleasure - a rush of wanting which in no way guarantees that the release of desire in the actual "having" will bestow as much satisfaction as that enjoyed in the emotional pursuit of that which is desired. If true, this leaves us in a selfperpetuating state of always chasing the carrot of our desire, leaves us in a prison of wanting without the reprieve of ever being sated. Such a state of habitual wanting without delighting in the fruition of having, may well be a curse of materialism, a curse which lends secular meaning to the theological notion of Hell.
